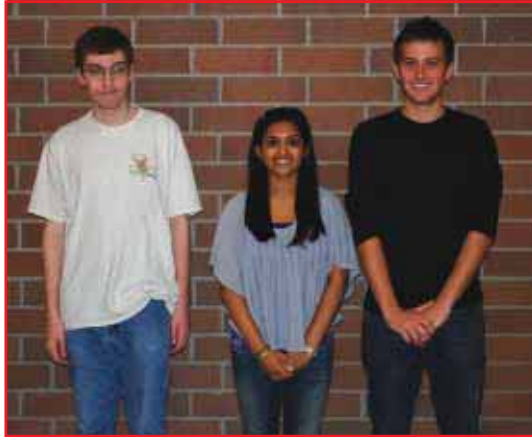


MAHS Homecoming Week –Homecoming Queen

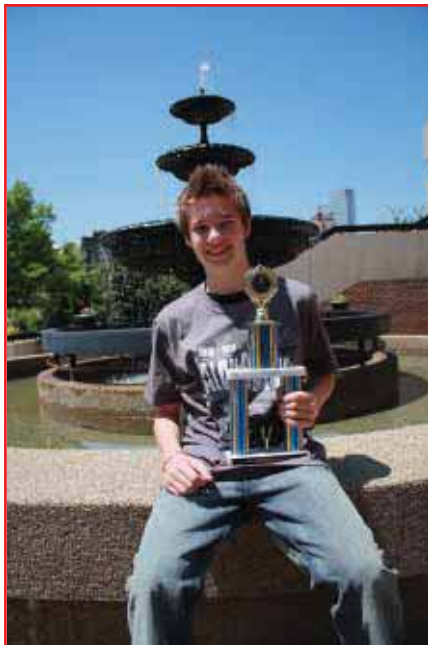
